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Monday

Thursday

Flowering plants produce seeds to reproduce. Quite often we eat the seeds of plants. Can you find examples of seeds that we eat in your home? You might not have thought of them as seeds but baked beans are the seeds of the haricot bean. What different types of seed can you find? If you are able to go outside, have a look for seeds outdoors too. Seeds such as dandelion seeds are blown by the wind to find a new place to grow. Other seeds (berries) are eaten by birds and distributed in bird droppings and some seeds find their way to a new site by hitching a ride on animal fur. Design a seed to get from your house to a new site. What features would help it arrive in the best condition? Can you make a model/drawing/animation of it?
