I want you to write an Acrostic poem using the words Easter Eggs. Write the words Easter Eggs alongside the left of your page so that the first line of the poem starts with E, the second line start with A, the third line starts with S and so on. You could be REALLY creative and make each line end with the letter too. (Tricky!!!) Record this on paper or on J2E.

Thursday

- A research activity for you. They don't just run in the order of the days of the week though! The information is quite hard to read on a lot of sites so it's the DATE that is important here.
