

## Year 5 - Week Beginning Monday June 15th

\* Try to read a little everyday - books, online reading, magazines, website. 15 MINUTES a day please - but of course I don't mind you reading more!

\* Try to keep your mind and your body active.

### Monday

- With last week's change in the weather, let's start this week with a workout - you choose the activity. Maybe Joe Wicks or a more gentle one. How about just having some quiet, 'Me' time? Why not just sit on your bed or in a quiet place and listen to the sounds. It's not always easy to have a quiet place but sometimes just on your own helps - even if it's just sitting on the stairs for a few minutes away from brothers and sisters.
- Onto some reading. Go back to <http://myths.e2bn.org/mythsandlegends/story2490-kaangs-people.html> and read along with it again. Now, it's your turn to write your own version of an African folk tale using Kaang's people to support you. You could make small changes in your innovation or BIG ones and invent your own tale. Remember, it needs to be simple for everyone to read, have a moral (a message) for the reader and needs to be set at a time when there were no cars, phones, electricity and people lived with animals as their equals. Read your tale carefully - does it make sense? Does it pass on a message? Think how you would perform this to a small group of people. Would they have parts to say, action to do or sounds to make? (If there are animals in the tale, maybe they wouldn't speak words, maybe they would make sounds.) We'll try this out when you're back in school.

### Tuesday

- Log on to the website and complete one of the Key Stage Two 'Daily Lessons'. You can scroll back and try one from last week instead. Find one you think will challenge you and that you will enjoy rather than thinking you have to stick to one specific day. <https://swanseavirtualschool.org/daily-lessons/>
- On your Longleat Safari last week, you met many of the animals you would see in Africa. I want you to get creative now. All you need is a pencil and a piece of paper. Choose your favourite animal - I like zebras because of the way each one has a different pattern, just as all humans have different finger prints. If you search on-line how to draw your chosen animal, you will get so many websites to help you. Enjoy! (You may want to try more than one.)

### Wednesday

- In our topic this term, we should be studying Africa. It is a HUGE place (look on a world map and you will see how small Great Britain is compared to Africa.) I want to show you just one small part of the country today.
