You decide what number to start on Eg. 17,20,23,26,29,32,35,38,41,44 Eg. 1619,1622,1625,1628,1631,1634,1637,1640,1643,1646 Now make your own number pattern – what number will you use to jump this time? You can jump in tens or hundreds to make it more challenging Eg. Jump in 135's, 627's, 49's	Can you change these words into plurals? It's not as easy as just adding an "s" at the end.  <b>leaf sandwich mouse goose</b> <b>brush hat sheep house</b> <b>coin tree cloud fish</b> Make a list of words that you have changed from singular to plural	Make a boat which floats successfully in water and can carry a cargo of at least one penny.
