Monday

- Reading - start the week off with some reading - use any of the resources you have. Books, on-line, any of the websites you have used here for reading. **Remember to try and read a little bit every day.** I'm enjoying reading the books I found in my cupboard that I'd forgotten about!(Mrs. R)
- In school, we have used the Pobble website. Use the Question Time questions to help you to plan and think of an ending for the story. The website will give you the story opener. Our task is to finish it off - and they aren't just allowed to go home for tea! <https://www.pobble365.com/jurassic/> (You may be best completing this on your J2E account as you will need to go back to it and edit on Wednesday. J2E means you can edit without needing to fully re-write it.)

Tuesday

- Practice your times tables today. Start off with TT Rockstars.

Wednesday

Could you have used more impressive, more descriptive language? Edit your story. Remember, you could always change to a 'purple pen' in J2E the same way you would have in your books in school. Don't rush this. Go for a QUALITY piece of work that you would be proud to show to anybody in the school - your friends, the teachers, any visitors. Remember to be proud of it yourself.

Thursday

- Test your tables a different way! Maybe use <https://www.coolmath4kids.com/math-games/grand-prix-multiplication?tid=8> or <https://www.primarygames.com/math/timestablesdiploma/> or J2blast.
- Another chance to develop you graph skills - <https://uk.ixl.com/math/year-5/interpret-line-graphs> Remember to look carefully at the questions - it may need a small calculation.

Friday

Let's get creative. Head back to the Pobble 365 page <https://www.pobble365.com/jurassic/> There is a section called 'Perfect Picture'. It's your turn to design a new park. You will need to think of anywhere you have been - it doesn't have to be a dinosaur park! What facilities would be there? Think about from the very start of the visit - car park, entrance hall where you would pay, maybe a museum, coffee shop, picnic area. (I'd better stop there or I'll be designing it for you!) What safety features would you need? (water filled ditches around the enclosures, a first aid post if you fell and cut yourself). If you have been to Folly Farm, that will help you think of the way the animal areas are laid out. I'm thinking of my visit to Longleat but we'll be visiting there in our activities next week.

Everyday

Try to keep your mind and your body active - Joe Wicks is getting SO famous but there are other fitness activities you could do that aren't so quick - maybe try some pilates.
