Click the link below: https://www.themathsfactor.com	Try making up some of your own silly tongue twisters using lots of words that start with the same sound! You could start with using your name e.g. 'Dan drew dancing dinosaurs!' How fast can you say them? Extra Challenge: Try writing your own tongue twister down and draw a picture to go with it.	Butterflies are symmetrical (a mirror image of both sides). You could fold a piece of paper in half, open it, add paint to one side only, fold it again and press the paint. Open it up to see both sides the same. You can then cut out a butterfly shape when it is dry.

Ask a partner to draw a picture of an object on a piece of paper/post-it and stick it to your head. Can you ask questions to try and guess what it is?	Sing a rainbow song. Have a look online for a song all about rainbows, for example 'I can sing a rainbow' or 'Over the Rainbow' What would you like to find in your pot of Gold at the end of a rainbow?

Friday	Playdough numbers You can either use ready made playdough or have a go at making your own. There are lots of recipes online. Have a go at making play dough numbers up to 10 or 20. Can you make the correct amount of balls or shapes to match the number.	Pretend to be a character from a book or tv show you enjoy. Have your family ask you questions and it's your job to answer the questions as the character. You could take it turns with your family to be different characters and ask each other questions. You may even want to dress up.	How are your seeds coming along? Are they starting to grow? Can you collect some leaves safely, and do some leaf rubbings? See what different patterns each leaf has.
